AN ORDINANCE LIMITING ON-STREET PARKING OF CERTAIN VEHICLES

WHEREAS, the Town of Ordway is experiencing crowded streets due to the unqualified parking of large oversized vehicles on the streets of Ordway;

whereas, the purpose of this ordinance is to regulate the parking of trucks, trailers and other similar vehicles and equipment of a certain size upon roadways within residential neighborhoods. Said vehicles and equipment tend to block the view of other vehicles and children playing in these neighborhoods as well as negatively impacting the aesthetics of the residential neighborhood.

whereas, This ordinance further provides for a restriction of the parking of said vehicles upon single-family residential properties in order to further protect the health, safety and general well-being of the residents of Ordway;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED as follows:

Section 1. New Sections 10.20.60 through 10.20.069 are enacted as follows:

10.20.060 Definitions. As used herein, the reference to truck, tractor, tractor trailer, trailer body, mobile home, house trailer, camper trailer, bus or any similar vehicle or equipment means vehicles or equipment having an overall length in excess of twenty (20) feet or a height of more than nine (9) feet.

10.20.061 Express or implied consent of property owner required.

It is a violation for any person to park or cause to be parked any vehicle upon any private or public property in the Town without the express or implied consent of the owner or person in possession and control of the property nor for a time period in excess of that time for which consent was given by the owner or person in possession and control of the property.

10.20.062 Designation of areas of implied consent; revocation as regards to posted areas; sign specifications.

a. There shall be an implied consent to park in areas set aside for parking on any public or private property, except on property used as a single-family residence.

- b. Off-street parking prohibitions. It shall be unlawful for anyone to store trucks, trailers or commercial vehicles, recreational vehicles, motor homes, travel trailers or campers as defined in this ordinance, on properties in residential zoning districts unless they comply with the following rules:
 - (1) Such storage shall not be located closer than three (3) feet to any side or rear lot line and ten (10) feet of any street line.
 - (2) Travel trailers or campers shall not exceed thirty-five (35) feet in length and eight (8) feet in width.
 - (3) Only one (1) such travel trailer or camper shall be permitted to be stored outdoors in any required yard setback areas of a lot on any residential zoning district.
 - (4) No travel trailer or camper stored in conformance with this subsection shall remain in such storage for longer than twelve (12) consecutive months.
 - (5) Any such vehicle stored in accordance with this subsection shall not be occupied and shall not be provided with utility connections other than required for vehicle maintenance and shall not be used for storage of any non-recreational material.
 - (6) The within section shall not apply to the storage of any construction vehicles engaged in construction for an active construction site.
 - (7) Only one (1) commercial vehicle of a rated capacity not exceeding two (2) tons with two (2) axles, owned or used by a resident of the premises, shall be permitted to be regularly parked or garaged on a lot in any residential zoning district. For purposes of this ordinance a commercial vehicle is a bus and/or vehicle advertising matter intending to promote the interest of any business, whether or not said vehicle is registered as a commercial vehicle with any State Division of Motor Vehicles.
- c. Prohibition. No person shall park or leave standing any motor vehicle upon any residential lawn area. Lawn area is defined as the property from the front of a residential house, condominium, or cooperative to the

street line other than a driveway, walkway, concrete or blacktopped surface parking space.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective on November 1, 2020.

ORDWAY VALLEY VIEW CEMETARY RULES

12.20.120 Fences, railings, decorations, and planting of vegetation.

Fences, railings, hedges and other obstructions and decorations other than flowers, vases, wreaths, and flags are prohibited, , and will be removed without notice. All decorations of lots or spaces and planting of vegetation within the cemetery shall be under control, supervision, and direction of the superintendent, who will governed by the rules and regulations of the cemetery.

(Ord. 274 § 12, 1969)

12.20.140 Prohibitions within cemetery

No person in the town cemetery shall:

- A. Drive or ride any machine or animal on lots, lawns, or walks;
- B. Drive an automobile or other vehicle in excess of twenty (20) miles per hour or such lesser speed as shall be prudent under the conditions and circumstances then existing;
- C. Discard papers, boxes and other unsightly articles in the cemetery;
- D. Cause any employee to do work for lot owners without and order from the superintendent or give any employee and valuable consideration to do work for the lot owner;
- E. Do work on the grounds, except by permission of the superintendent;
- F. Perform, or cause to be performed a burial in the cemetery on Sunday without a special permit therefor issued by the board of trustees on written recommendation of the health officers;
- G. Disturb the birds or fowl in any way, this includes, hunting, discharge of any firearms and/or other missiles withing or over any portion of the cemetery or around the gates, fences or roads adjoining the dam, expect as a part of military funerals or similar occasions;
- H. Deface, damage, or destroy or injure any monuments, markers, signs and/or other property in the town cemetery.



- iii. The number of Medical Marijuana Testing Facilities located in the Town shall be limited to one (1).
- iv. The number of Retail Marijuana Testing Facilities located in the Town shall be limited to one (1).
- B. Notwithstanding the enactment of this chapter, no other Medical or Retail businesses shall be allowed or licensed within the Town other than those listed in this section.
- C. Upon receipt of more applications for more marijuana dispensaries of any kind than are allowed under this section, the Town shall act upon only the first completed applications submitted and reject all subsequent applications.

Website Accessibility for ADA Compliance (cont.)

Addressing Accessibility and DOJ Resources. According to the DOJ, one way to help meet the ADA's effective communication requirements is to ensure that your websites have accessible features for people with disabilities. Another option is to provide an alternative, accessible way for citizens to use the programs or services otherwise provided on-line, such as a staffed telephone information line. But these types of alternatives can be cost-prohibitive and according to the DOJ, are "unlikely to provide an equal degree of access in terms of hours of operation and the range of options and programs available."

The DOJ has published a variety of resources to assist municipalities in assessing website accessibility issues and options for compliance. Click here for the Website Accessibility chapter from DOJs "ADA Best Practices Tool Kit for State and Local Governments." And click here for a related DOJ document that includes additional technical information for web developers. This document includes links to information about web features that can make a web page more accessible or less accessible to persons with disabilities, and to web design standards.

Website Accessibility Standards. Neither the ADA nor related regulations dictate exactly what technical standards must be met to make a website ADA compliant, but recent DOJ settlement agreements are insightful. For example, through several voluntary compliance agreements with Colorado municipalities—which are entered to settle pending or potential enforcement actions—the DOJ has required compliance with the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines ("WCA Guidelines") developed by the Web Accessibility Initiative.

The WCA Guidelines are technical standards intended to provide "a single shared standard for web content accessibility," including information on "how to make web content more accessible to people with disabilities," addressing both natural content—e.g., text, images and sounds—as well as underlying code and markup that defines the website's structure and presentation. These settlement agreements also typically include requirement for periodic reviews, additional training, and clear notices of how and where individuals can request accessible information and provide input on accessibility issues. Conclusion. As noted in the Denver Post story, the recent rash of website accessibility lawsuits filed in the Colorado federal courts is the result of aggressive tactics of an out-of-state law firm. While these tactical lawsuits have been on the rise in other states too, as reported here, the underlying issue of website accessibility is real...and an issue that should be proactively addressed. Checking up on your compliance may prevent you from being the target of this recent trend in "click-by" claims but, more importantly, will confirm your commitment to the letter and spirit of the ADA, and to serving the needs of your community.
